QUALIFICATIONS

1. Character

Candidates for and any person holding the office must be of good character.

2. Health

Candidates shall:

- (a) be free from any defect or disease which would render them unsuitable to hold the office and be in a state of health such as would indicate a reasonable prospect of ability to render regular and efficient service;
- (b) be free from any disability which would interfere with the proper discharge of the duties of the office;

or

be in a state of health such as would indicate a reasonable prospect of ability to render regular and efficient service.

The appointee will be required to undergo a medical examination before appointment by the Hospital's Medical Examiner for the purpose of satisfying the requirements as to health.

3. Statutory Registration Professional Qualifications, Experience etc.

Candidates shall: -

- (i) Be registered on the Radiography Division of the Radiographers Register maintained by the Radiographers Registration Board at CORU.

Or

- (ii) Applicants who satisfied the conditions set out in Section 91 of the Health and Social Care Professionals Act 2005, (**see note 1* below**), must submit proof of application for registration with the Radiographers Registration Board at CORU. The acceptable proof is correspondence from the Radiographers Registration Board at CORU confirming the current status of their application for registration as a Section 91 applicant.

And

- (iii) Have the requisite knowledge and ability (including a high standard of suitability and professional ability) for the proper discharge of the duties of the office.

(4) Annual registration

- (i) On appointment practitioners must maintain annual registration on the relevant division of the Radiographers Register maintained by the Radiographers Registration Board at CORU.

And

- (ii) Practitioners must confirm annual registration with CORU to the Hospital.

Desirable Qualifications

Minimum 12 months post qualification with clinical experience

Experience in General Radiography/A &E /CT/PACS

Post graduate course in CT

Diploma in Medical Ultrasound

Certificate in Radiation Protection

5. Age

Age restriction shall only apply to a candidate where she/he is not classified as a new entrant (within the meaning of the Public Service Superannuation (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 2004). A candidate who is not classified as a new entrant must be under 65 years of age on the first day of the month in which the latest date for receiving completed application forms for the office occurs.

Note 1*

Section 91 candidates are individuals who qualified before the 31th October 2013 and have been engaged in the practice of the profession in the Republic of Ireland for a minimum of 2 years fulltime (or an aggregate of 2 years fulltime), between 31st October 2008 and 30th October 2013.

To be considered as a Section 91 applicant, individuals must have applied to CORU for registration prior to the 31st October 2015.
